What is a Tiny Forest?

Tiny Forests are 30 times denser and grow about 10 times faster than traditional forests, due to a special planting method used. As the forest establishes and attracts insects, birds, reptiles and small mammals, it becomes up to 100 times more biodiverse than monoculture forests.

Tiny Forests connect people with nature in their local area and support general wellbeing. They serve as inspiring outdoor learning classrooms and a point of social connection for local communities.

No prior experience is necessary. Our wonderful Earthwatch staff will be train you in maintenance techniques, and provide valuable insights into conservation research.
